

THE WORKSHOP IN SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT PRACTICE

The Workshop in Sustainable Development Practice is a course for second-year Master's degree students in the Economic and Political Development (EPD) Concentration at SIPA, and for a limited number of students in other SIPA concentrations and programs. Through the workshop, students gain practical experience while assisting a diverse range of clients on a variety of assignments related to international development. Working in teams with a faculty advisor, students take a multidisciplinary approach to their work and learn extensively from each other as well as from the hands-on tasks of the workshop itself. A key strength of the workshop is that it encourages students to explore the intersection of development concerns with human rights, corporate social responsibility, humanitarian affairs, conflict resolution, education, public health, gender, environmental policy, entrepreneurship and private sector development, governance and technology. In a typical year, workshop projects would also involve in-country field work over SIPA's winter and/or spring breaks, which would enable teams to visit project areas, engage directly with key stakeholders, and develop actionable and locally appropriate recommendations for their clients. Due to continuing COVID-19 restrictions, most of this year's workshop teams have conducted their work remotely. The workshop is coordinated by the EPD Concentration.

Starting with two projects in Belize and Jamaica in 1987-1988, the Workshop in Sustainable Development Practice has grown to become an essential part of the EPD Concentration, and one of the models for SIPA's capstone program. Through over 400 projects in over 30 years, close to 2,800 second-year students have done cutting-edge work with over 200 development clients and partners in over 90 countries.
